OVERVIEW

St. Luke's school network with different groups and conducted for the external and internal center learning. The School conducted exposure, field trip, Sunday apostolic work, joint prayer services and sharing with different denominations for peace and unity. Within this two years, first and second year (81) students involved in this program. The program allows the students to visit to a place outside the regular classroom - designed to achieve cross learning, skill and gave opportunity for learning through networking. The major aims are

- Cultural exposure to different places
- Cross learning experience with the other centers of learning
- Direct exposure to faith communities of different culture
- Testing the socio pastoral training skills with communities
- Exposure to the curriculum and pedagogy of other centers
- Understanding the socio pastoral needs of the community through discussion.
- Communication of the Word, catechetical message to faith communities.

METHODS

- Face to face interaction with students and staff of other institutes
- Maintaining log books, journals and personal reflection papers
- Group sharing and discussion among the students every day.
- Exposure to other cultural expressions – drama, dance and the dresses
- Understanding through communication with communities
- Testing the skills learned in the institute through hands on experience in the field.
- In depth discussions with the staff of the various institutes.
- Developing inter personal skills through listening etc.


Patrick Nkawng Zau Mun

Patrick Hpulum Zau Doi

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

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
